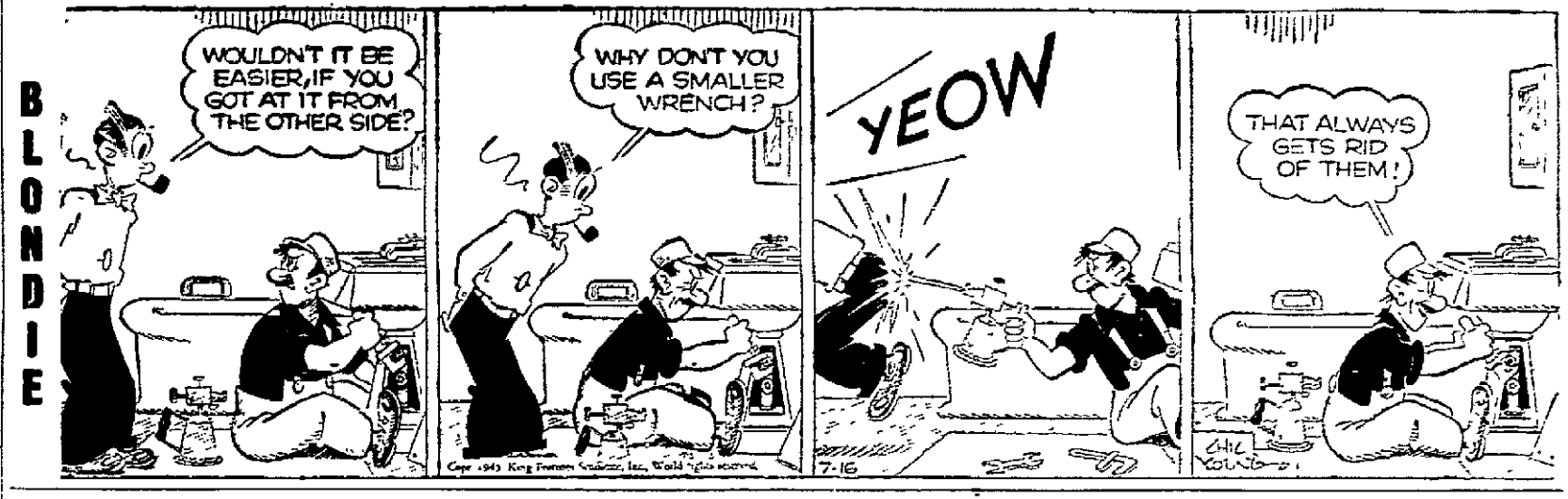
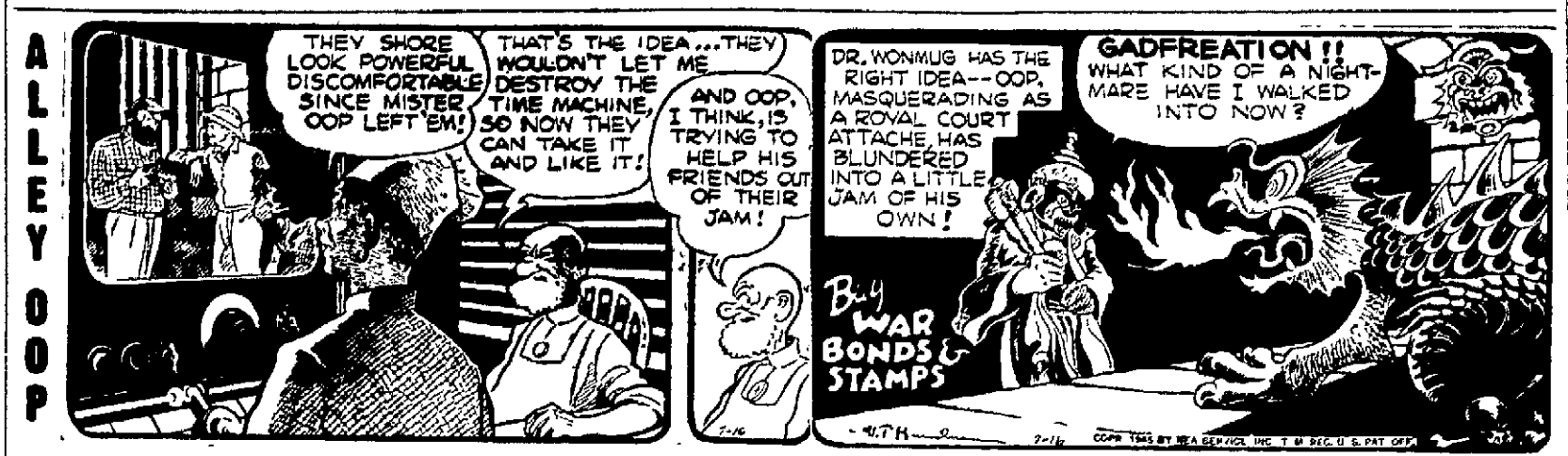
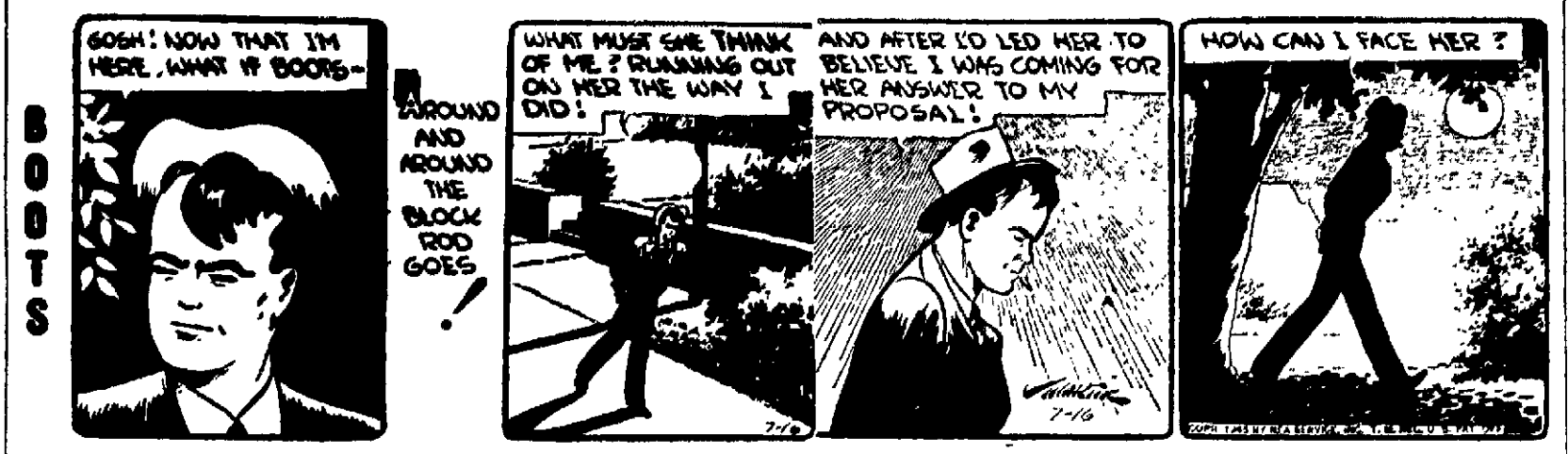

Newspaper To Cut Paper Use

WASHINGTON, July 16—(UP)—The Cincinnati Times-Star has agreed in a consent order to reduce its newspaper consumption by at least 90 tons a quarter until a 547-1/2 ton overconsumption has been accounted for, the War Production Board announced today.

The newspaper was charged by WPB with exceeding its newspaper quota by 647 1/2 tons during the fourth quarter of 1943 and the first three quarters of 1944. It was brought out at a hearing that the company was entitled to a credit of 100 tons for transit damage.

The newspaper did not question the violation, WPB said, but reported the over-consumption was due to a miscalculation of its base period.
