

"And Then There Were None"

Commences At Quilna Friday

For spine-tingling suspense and electrifying thrills—for a story that's as unusually exciting as it is excitedly unusual—for sheer, solid motion picture entertainment, "And Then There Were None," opening at the Quilna theatre Friday, is a "must see" on anyone's film list.

Filming of Agatha Christie's world-famous masterpiece of mystery features one of the most brilliant casts of the year's headed by Academy Award-winner Barry Fitzgerald. The devil-dogs, leathernecks or Marines, if you prefer, are deserving of a salute and they get it in "Salute To The Marines" opening Sunday at the Allen theatre. The heroism of these men thrust some of the worst stages of this global conflict which just came to an end, truly is magnificent. The co-feature of the film to open Sunday is "Cheyenne Wildcat."

SEPTEMBER MILK OUTPUT SETS RECORD IN OHIO

COLUMBUS, Nov. 2—(AP)—The Ohio Cooperative Dairy Reporting Service says deliveries of fluid and manufacturing milk to Ohio's licensed handlers during September surpassed all previous records for that month.

The report showed manufacturing plants received an estimated 169,000,000 pounds and markets, 126,000,000 pounds. Removal of restrictions on sales quotas increased seasonally the quantity of fluid milk delivered to Ohio's principal markets, the service said.
