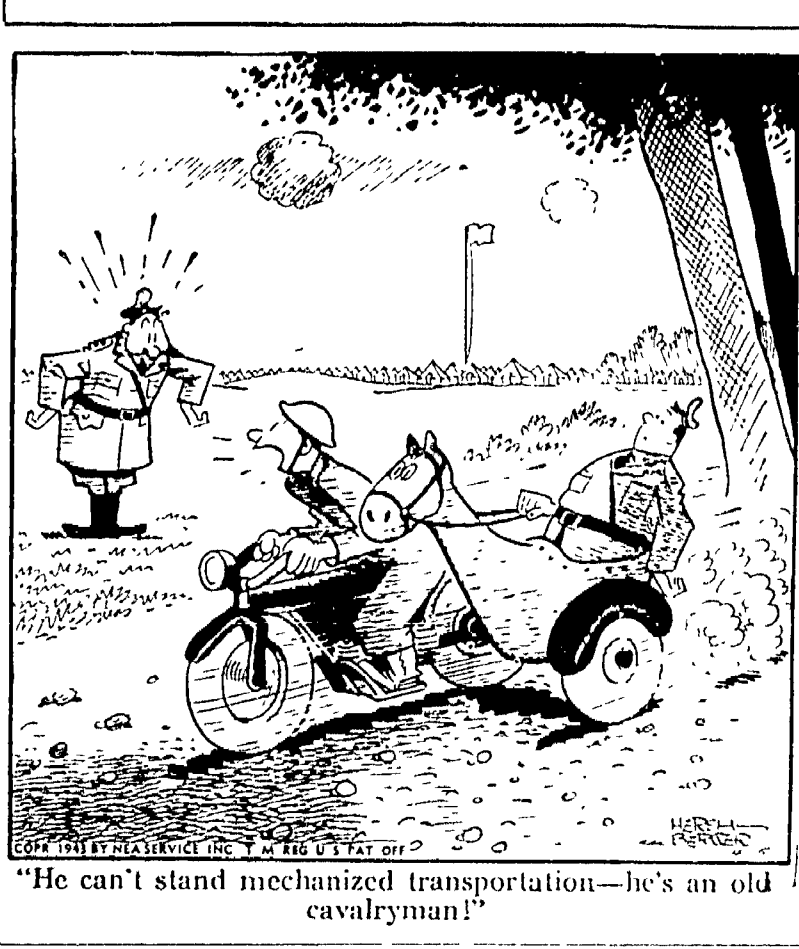

I read with interest your editorial in the March 24 issue of The Lima News entitled "Future Must Be Guarded."

Dr. Chase, no doubt, is an authority on the subject of taxation. We can whole heartedly agree with his statement to the effect that "We have only begun to tax." The question now presents itself on who and where are the future taxes to be levied. So far the burden of taxation has fallen on the working men and women of our nation—those least able to pay. As an example, the increased taxes on income in the lower brackets, the five per cent victory tax, the sales tax here in Ohio, and the hundreds of invisible or indirect taxes which we pay.

It would appear logical that a real win the war tax program should be based on ability to pay. The UE-CIO has a win the war tax program. The main points of the program follows:

1. Exempt from taxation all single persons earning \$800 a year or less.
2. Exempt all married couples earning \$1500 or less with an additional allowance of \$400 for each dependent.
3. Taxes on corporate profits to 55%. Now it is only 40%. The 55% was proposed by the Treasury Department but voted down. For a limited number of cases, relief for those companies who have legitimate debt obligations outstanding.
4. For the duration no corporation should expect to earn more than five per cent on its first 10 million dollars of invested capital and four per cent on all amounts above that. The UE proposes a 100% excess profits tax above these levels.
5. The repeal of the so called 5% victory tax, because it imposes a direct tax on all wages down to the worker who earns only 12 dollars a week with no regard to living costs, family, and dependents.
6. The UE favors the Robertson Plan. This plan is a pay as you go plan, contrary to the Ruml Plan which would exempt the rich. The Robertson Plan would exempt taxes for those in the lower income brackets.
7. A sharp increase in the percentage of taxation on income of \$2000 and increasing rapidly and progressively after \$5000. These taxes should be levied in such a way so that no income would be permitted to exceed \$25,000.

Story Of U. S. Marine Corps Coming To Lyric On Tuesday

John Payne, Randolph Scott And Maureen O'Hara Cast In Portrayal Of What It Takes To Be A Leatherneck

The smashing story of the U. S. Marine Corps and what it takes to turn out a fighting "Leatherneck" has been brilliantly brought to the screen in the technicolor epic, "To the Shores of Tripoli," which starts at the Lyric on Tuesday. John Payne, Randolph Scott and Maureen O'Hara are the leading stars. Also due to open is "Moonlight," a stirring story of life along the Pacific waterfront. "Timber" and "Isle of Missing Men" show thru Monday.

Lloyd Nolan, in "Time To Kill," currently at the Quilna walks into a veritable snake's nest of trouble when he is hired to trace the theft of a rare and valuable coin, known as the "brasher doubloon." Jack Benny starts out bankrupt in his new film, "The Meanest Man In Town," now at the Quilna. He portrays an attorney in a small town.

Washington, D. C., during the days when war surged close to the suburbs of the nation's capital, is the locale and period of such of the action of "Tennessee Johnson," due Tuesday at the Ohio. Lionel Barrymore, Van Heflin and Ruth Hussey have three principal roles. Showing thru Monday will be "In Which We Serve," a story about a ship and what happens to it from the day it sets out to sea until it is destroyed.

"Pituri," the unusual adventure film due to open an engagement at the Sigma Wednesday, has as its setting the rivers and jungles of Australia's northwest and deals with the lives of the bush blacks, depicting their dances, conflicts and customs. It tells of a girl—a writer—who penetrates into the wastelands to find a white man who has become king of a native tribe.

Now showing at the State is "Eyes of the Underworld," which is based on the vicious activities of a thoroughly organized motor car theft gang. Wendy Barrie and Don Porter are prominent in the distinguished cast which stars Richard Dix. The co-feature is "Casablanca," which tells about the hazardous existence of refugees stranded in the North African city.

Monday will be the final day for the showing of "Affairs of Jimmy Valentine" and "Lady in a Jam," at the Majestic.

LYRIC

As timely and as thrilling a subject for a movie as you'll ever want to see is the plot basis for the technicolor production "To the Shores of Tripoli" which is scheduled to open on Tuesday at the Lyric theatre.

Taking a raw recruit in the person of John Payne, the film puts him thru all of the paces which the U. S. Marine undergoes to emerge a fighting "leatherneck." And Randolph Scott is said to turn in one of the top performances of his career as the hard-boiled sergeant who makes life both interesting and miserable for Payne.

UNIONS URGE RETENTION OF RENT CEILINGS

Lima and Allen-co CIO locals Monday were being urged to wire Trenton Brown, OPA administrator, Washington, appealing to him to hold the rent control program tight.

Big real estate men are pressuring Brown to relax the rent control program so that landlords may raise rents all over the nation, according to Raymond G. Sowder, recording secretary of the Greater Cincinnati Industrial Union Council and Harry Habberthar, CIO field representative of Cincinnati.

The unions were urged to state in their communication that remedy is "not less rent but more effective price control."

"If organized landlords crack rent ceilings, the result will be equivalent to serious wage cut," the labor leaders said.
