

Revivals Of Two Movie Hits At Quilna Open Saturday

Over the period of a good many years the legitimate theatre has been in the habit of making almost yearly revivals of certain of its past great hits. Shakespeare, Shaw, Henry Arthur Jones, Pinero and Sherwood all have produced works which have more or less become hardy perennials.

Two films being offered at the Quilna theatre, beginning Saturday, are "Pennies from Heaven" with Bing Crosby and "Mr. Deeds Goes To Town" with Gary Cooper and Jean Arthur. Of course, revivals of famous films are nothing new. More and more people are finding that favorite screenplays are becoming increasingly welcome on their returns. These two films are of the screen's happiest hits and are here to delight your heart again.

Covering George Gershwin's life span from the time he was 10, thru July, 1937, when, at the age of 38, he died, "Rhapsody in Blue," now showing at the Ohio theatre, has its main story thread following thru the age of 18. More than two dozen Gershwin numbers including all of its more serious work as well as his best-known popular song hits—comprise the film's remarkably rich musical background.

Margaret O'Brien has one of the most outstanding roles in her whole screen career in "Our Vines Have Tender Grapes," the film which will open at the Sigma theatre Saturday. Starring with Margaret is Edward G. Robinson, James Craig, Agnes Moorehead and a superb supporting cast who help make this film truly outstanding. Margaret has the appealing role of a little girl who has a big heart and is always ready to give. As in other pictures, she walks off with a magnificent screen triumph.

If it's mystery you're after—then there is plenty to be found in "Uncle Harry" the film showing at the State theatre and starring George Sanders, Ella Raines and Geraldine Fitzgerald. A jealous sister proves to be the basis of this highly suspenseful film and a surprise ending is in store for all that see it.

Billed for one day at the Lyric theatre are the two films "Haunted Ranch" and "Law of the Jungle," a couple of films which will afford good entertainment for the young and old alike. Coming Saturday night are "Little Joe the Wrangler" and "Crime Doctor's Courage" with Warner Baxter. Jackie Cooper is currently to be seen in "Boy of the Streets," one of the first movies made by Jackie—and what is perhaps his most successful. Sharing the billing is "Both Barrels Blazing" with Charles Starrett in the title role now showing at the Allen theatre.
