62,604 Receiving Unemployment Aid

COLUMBUS, Oct. 6.—(INS)—Ohio Bureau of Unemployment Compensation officials said today that 62,604, or slightly more than half of the 120,000 persons who filed claims for compensation during the five week period from V-J day to Sept. 22, are receiving benefits.

Reason for those not receiving compensation include return to employment, failure to qualify, refusal to accept jobs, unavailability for work, and quitting jobs without acceptable cause.
